We have 83 staff members at our school, while you may have met some of them at various events, often due to work and family commitments you don't always have the chance to get to know them. So I thought that I would put on my reporters cap and start interviewing them and who better to start with than our Year 7 Adviser for 2015, Mr Andrew Grant-Frost aka 'Frostie.' I tried to edit my interview to fit in this column but it just wasn't the same, so this is **Part 1 of Andrew's story**



Andrew started life at Singleton where his father was a country vet; next they moved to Coonabarabran where his love of horses began at the local Pony Club. Another move took the family to Mudgee where Andrew finished his schooling.

Being a young man who liked adventure Andrew took a job in the Bylong Valley breaking in quarter horses using a technique known as the 'Jefferson method.' Andrew explained that this involves sound and touch it was a method used by the Sioux Indians.

In the early 90's Andrew headed to Bondi in Sydney working at various jobs such as real estate property management and landscape gardening. During this time he began playing rugby union for Eastern Suburbs and

played first grade.

His next move was to take up a one year traineeship with the National Bank as a money market dealer; this led to a senior role in their money market and bond trading. During this period Andrew began studying a Bachelor of Economics and Finance at the University of Western Sydney. Andrew explains this as a very interesting time giving him an insight into how the corporate world behaves. To fill in his spare time Andrew took up boxing at the local Police Boys Club.

From here he headed to Macquarie University to study for his Masters in Management including the study of organisation psychology and how the corporate world behaves. Throughout this period Andrew began a lifelong journey with another of his sporting passions, Muay Thai, better known as Thai Kick Boxing. He explained that he was mentored by some gifted trainers, such as a three times World Champion, whom he would train with for 20-30 hours a week at a gym in Sydney. He also studied Brazilian Jiu Jitsui in Sydney with another mentor who was a famous Olympic Welter Weight Champion. Andrew is a certified Muay Thai trainer known as a Kru (trainer in Thai) it takes 3,000 training hours to achieve this certificate. As if all this was not enough he also managed a pub in Sydney during this time.

Now, many years later, each year when the school holds its Well Being Day, Andrew teaches the students the basics of Muay Thai. (See photos) **Part 2 next week**
