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Host an Italian Student?

Our sister school in Italy has three students who would like to come and live with us for 3 months next year. This is separate to our regular exchange arrangement. The stay is scheduled for May, June and July 2017. Each is a 17 year old girl seeking to live with an Evans River family, attend school with us, learn more of Australian life and become better English (Australian!) speakers. Our Italian Exchange coordinator in Italy said of two of the girls: 'Sophia P is a lovely girl. She is bright, well-mannered and used to travelling, she has travelled with her school to Oxford- England, Dublin-Ireland and Brighton- England and has stayed both in a college and with families. She is easy to get on with and Sophia B is a delightful girl who is into sport, reading and music.' I am still waiting on profile information for the third student. Families who have hosted in the past have spoken highly of the experience — not only for their child, but for the whole family. If you are able to host an exchange period for some or, all of the visit, please email or phone the school office letting us know.

Merit Awards

The school has in place systems for ensuring students are recognised for good conduct, effort and attitude. Known as the merit award system, students are recognised for a range of positive behaviours including submission of quality work, asking good questions and/or participating well in class, having required equipment with them, helping others and wearing the correct clothing for the activities in which they are involved. The awards are cumulative in that students gain individual merits and they accumulate until certain thresholds are reached. These thresholds vary depending on the age of the child. As the number of merits a child receives grows they qualify for bronze, silver, gold and platinum awards (year 7 to 12 students may also qualify for a Diamond Award). Individual classes and faculty areas have award systems which contribute to the acquisition of merit awards. Parents and students can track the achievement of merits through the parent and student portals.

Year 7 2017 Technology

The technology initiative described in two recent newsletters was discussed and supported at last week's School Council meeting. It will be raised again at Monday's P&C meeting. The drafted information pack relating to this initiative will be discussed at the meeting and It is intended this will be distributed to parents in the days subsequent to the meeting. The initiative is set to strongly enhance learning opportunities for our students. The notebook computers have excellent features. They are valued at \$625 but will be made available to our Year 7 2017 families for \$300. Families will have the option of buying the devices outright or paying them off through an agreed payment plan. The devices will be issued to students at a Year 7 parent and student information

Technology) was on hand to receive the prize on Monday, 7th November.


