#### Explaining Student Absences

To be brief: NSW law requires students to attend school every day that lessons are offered. Parents and carers are required to see this is the case. Parents and carers can apply to the Principal for leave for a student to be absent before the absence or have leave granted retrospectively by seeking to explain an absence after the event. There are very few reasons for which a Principal may grant leave. Primarily



sickness. Where no acceptable (in terms of policy) explanation is received, an unjustified absence is recorded. Parents are asked to ensure absences are explained in advance, or if after, within 3 days of the absence. Once the number of unjustified absences reaches a certain level, action will be instigated by the Department of Education which can eventually lead to a family being taken to court. We have had families taken to court in the last 12 months.

#### Preparing for a positive COVID case

In last week's newsletter I outlined the process to be followed should we have a positive COVID case at our school. If you have a positive case in your family, please notify the school. During school hours, use the usual school phone number 6682 6666. Out of hours use 0439 822 588. It is recommended you save this number into your phone now.


