#### **Breakfast Muffins**

#### Ingredients:

6 eggs

2-3 cups mixed vegetables (carrot, capsicum, green onion and frozen peas)

2 slices of ham


2 Ths milk

1/2 cup reduced fat grated cheese

Pepper to season

#### Method:

- Preheat oven to 160 degrees and grease a 12 hole muffin tin.
- Cut all vegetables and ham into small pieces.
- Whisk milk and eggs together then add vegetables and ham. Add pepper and mix well.
- Pour mixture into muffin tins and top each muffin with a small amount of cheese.
- Bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes.
- Serve warm or cold.


