Congratulations to the Class of 2022. We are very proud of the people you have become and look forward to staying in touch in a different way as you live your adult lives.




Centrelink has payments for $\underline{\text{students and trainees}}$ to help you with the costs of doing uni, TAFE or an apprenticeship.


