

For the school, this means we gain continued access to her skills for an extended period. Thank you for all you have done for us Mrs Hart.

Julian Rocks Snorkeling

Evans River Marine Studies has had a busy end of term. As usual, we have been fishing the local waterways and have caught some unusual sea creatures including shovel-nose sharks and stingrays. The biggest news has been that we finally got out on our snorkelling trip to Nguthungulli (Julian Rocks, Byron Bay). The weather and seas all finally aligned and we ended up with a picture-perfect sunny day. Nguthungulli is special because it is a Marine Reserve and a meeting place for marine species that live in temperate (cold) and tropical (warm) waters. On this day, the temperate current came through which made the water a little green and cold, but the cold current also brought the rare opportunity to see 6 or so Grey Nurse Sharks congregating in a spot along the rocks called the turtle trench. The largest shark was about 3 metres in length and they look quite fearsome with needlelike teeth. We had some close encounters with some of the sharks that were curious about us. However, they were quite docile and seemed unphased by the 20 over-excited splashing teenagers in the water with them. We also managed to see the strange sight of a turtle sleeping on the head of a wobbegong shark (look closely at the photo and see if you can spot the wobbegong underneath the turtle). This time, we also managed to avoid any sea-sick students as well, so the trip really was a complete success.
