The University has committed to an annual grant of \$5000 to support our work with indigenous students and the school intents to see the funds used as a prize for students, in particular senior students in their endeavours to take the next step beyond school.

We enjoyed a meal prepared by Lilli Gillespie and team, witnessed student performances, heard reports of student achievements and most importantly recognised individual student achievement through many awards. There can be no doubt many of our students are making strong progress in their schooling.



#### **Demerit Points:**

The Demerit Points Scheme is a national program that allocates penalty points (demerits) for a range of driving offences. A driver who has not committed any offences has 'zero' points. If you commit an offence that carries demerit

points, the points are added to your driving record.

If you incur the threshold number of demerit points within a three-year period, a licence suspension or refusal is applied.

The three-year period is calculated between the dates the offences were committed. It ends on the day your most recent offence was committed.
